

Phyllis Weber Receives Award from NKF

Phyllis Weber, CEO of the **California Transplant Donor Network**, received the National Kidney Foundation's *Champions of Hope - Advocate Award* for her, and CTDN's, work changing the lives of thousands of transplant recipients.

Ms. Weber was honored for her tireless dedication in support of the work of NKF and the kidney patient community in Northern California and Northern Nevada. The NKF established the Champions of Hope Awards to recognize those who have made a significant impact on the kidney patient community.

Phyllis Weber is the CEO of the California Transplant Donor Network, a position she has held since 1988. Prior to that she was the Program Director of a hospital-based organ and tissue procurement organization and a Renal Transplant Coordinator at California Pacific Medical Center in San Francisco.

Ms. Weber received a diploma in nursing at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania where she had her first experience with organ transplantation. During her professional career, she has served as the President of AOPO, been on the UNOS Board of Directors, and Co-chaired the Organ Transplant Breakthrough Collaborative. In a volunteer capacity, she sits on the Board of Directors of the Blood Centers of the Pacific and the Physicians' Foundation of California Pacific Medical Center. Ms. Weber is a founder and board member for Donate Life California, the California state organ and tissue donor registry.
